Odyssey Chapter 21 (XXI) Reading and Response

**Instructions:** 

- 1. Watch Course Hero summary and analysis video with this link.
- 2. Access The Odyssey on Project Gutenberg and read Chapter 21 (XXI) with this link.
- **3.** Closing Prompt: Write 100-150 words on the purpose of the trail of the axes in this chapter. Try to explain what effect it has on the development of Odysseus/Ulysses as a character. Due Monday, April 6<sup>th</sup> by 8am.

#### Close Reading and Analysis of Chapter 22 (XXII)

- 1. Watch the Course Hero video for Chapter 22/XXII with this link.
- 2. Read Chapter 22/XXII on Project Gutenberg with this link.
- **3. Literary Analysis Paragraph:** Write 250-300 words defending and criticizing the harsh justice dealt onto the members of the household by Odysseus/Ulysses. What is the intended moral of this story for classical Greek society? Due Monday, April 6<sup>th</sup> by 8am.

### Teacher Support - TEAMS

#### To Be Graded

Assignment for students to submit on TEAMS Assignments page:

- 1. Journal response to Chapter 21 (100-150 words).
  - Due Monday, April 6th, 2020 by 8:00am.
  - Use MLA format and formal, academic English.
  - You will be assessed on how well you identify the primary characteristics and personality traits of Odysseus/Ulysses based on his description, behavior, and dialogue in the text. Provide specific examples whenever you can to support your analysis of the character.
  - Responses that are vague, misleading, or inaccurate will be significantly marked down.
- 2. Literary Analysis paragraph (250-300 words).
  - Due Monday, April 6th, 2020 by 8:00am.
  - Use MLA format and formal, academic English.
  - Provide <u>at least one direct quote</u> as evidence to support your analysis.
  - You will be assessed on how well you analyze and explain the thematic connections relating to the harsh treatment of the maids and suitors in Chapter 22.
  - You will also be assessed on how effectively you use text evidence in the form of a direct quote to support your analysis and explanation. Unrelated quotes that do not support your analysis/explanation will be marked down significantly.
  - Responses that are vague, misleading, or inaccurate will be significantly marked down.
  - Earn points by demonstrating a thorough understanding of the concept of justice as an important theme in The Odyssey and by using appropriate, relevant text evidence effectively.

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What assignments will the student submit?

- 1. Journal response to Chapter 21 (100-150 words) due Monday, April 6, 2020, by 8:00am.
- 2. Literary Analysis paragraph (250-300 words) due Monday, April 6, 2020, by 8:00am.

How will it be submitted?

Attach assignment responses in the form of a word document to the respective assignment in the Assignments tab on Teams.
